



## **Overview & FAQ's - Coaching Education Subsidy 2025-26**

**sportscotland's** Coaching Scotland framework sets out a vision where they will work together with governing bodies to create a workforce with greater diversity that is representative of the Scottish population.

**sportscotland** and Scottish Cycling have worked together to agree a new approach to coach/leadership education subsidy that supports this aim. The new approach is designed to be applied directly to British Cycling's new Coach Education Framework.

This new approach has the following aims:

- Build the capacity of coaches and leaders with a focus on inclusion.
- Support and develop a more diverse workforce.
- Ensure qualifications in Scotland are affordable and accessible.
- Embed equality, diversity and inclusion through the education system in Scotland.

In line with Scottish Cycling strategy 'Developing a nation of cyclists 2.0', this iteration of subsidy will be aligned towards a select number of identified underrepresented groups in cycling across Scotland. Those from a rural location, coaches with a disability, coaches living in an area of deprivation, female coaches, and young coaches (under 25).

Alongside the subsidy available for coaches, we are delighted to provide a subsidy for Mountain Bike Leaders to upskill and progress through qualifications.

The Mountain Bike Leadership course subsidy applies to the Off-Road Leader course (previously FUN-MBL), and the training element of the following courses but not the assessment section.

- Trail Leader course (previously Level 2 MTB Leader)
- Level 3 MTB Leader course
- MTB Night Leader course

Candidates must apply for the subsidy prior to the course taking place and will only be reimbursed after successfully completing the Off- Road Leader course or training element of the Trail Leader, Level 3 MTB Leader or MTB Night Leader courses.

Taking effect for courses taking place from May 2025 until 31<sup>st</sup> March 2026

Please note that this funding is not guaranteed, should the available funds be exhausted before 31st March, the funding will be discontinued.

Rural Leaders	Leaders from a rural area.	50%, with £200 being the maximum <b>Training Element Only.</b>
Leaders with a disability	Any leader who has a registered disability or who can demonstrate a positive impact working with riders who have a disability. This demonstration is captured through the application process.	
SIMD leaders	A leader whose permanent residence is within SIMD 1-4 or who can demonstrate a positive impact working with riders residing within SIMD 1-4. This demonstration is captured through the application process.	
Female leaders	Any female leader	
Young leaders (14-25)	Any leader who is aged 14-25yrs

### Step by Step

Step	Coaching Courses (i2C/CiC)	MTB Leadership
1	Book on and pay for a course.	
2	<a href="#">Complete SC subsidy application form.</a>	
3		Applicant to provide copy of the invoice of the course to Scottish Cycling.
4	Receive an email of confirmation and notification of application outcome.	
5	Funds will be processed after the first 'in person' element of the course and once the candidate has confirmed attendance.	

### What are coach education subsidies?

This is funding provided by **sportscotland** via Scottish Cycling to assist coaches/leaders to reduce the cost of their learning and development as this can often be seen as a barrier to participation and development.

### Is this new support and what are the changes?

Coach education funding has been in place since 2010 supporting hundreds of coaches. The funding available to individuals through this programme is revised quarterly, any changes to the fund will be communicated. Funding will continue to be offered to developing coaches/leaders but with a focus on identified underrepresented groups.

### Who can apply for coach education funding?

Coaches/leaders applying for funding must have a valid British Cycling membership.

### Guidance on specific categories:

- **Rural Coach/Leaders** – Any riders from a rural or island community. The government's core definition of rurality which defines Settlements of less than 3,000 people and with a drive time of over 30 minutes to a settlement of 10,000.
- **Young Coach/Leaders** - Any coach who is aged 14-25yrs.
- **Women and Girls Coaches/Leaders** - Any female coach.
- **SIMD Coaches/Leaders** – 'SIMD' refers to the Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation. This is a Scottish Government measure across seven domains: income, employment, health, education, skills and training, housing, geographical access and crime, proving an overall rank of deprivation. To find out if your postcode or the postcode of riders falls within deciles 1-4 please head to [SIMD \(Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation\)](#) . Any coach whose permanent residence postcode is within [SIMD](#) deciles 1-4 or who can demonstrate a positive impact working with riders residing within SIMD deciles 1-4 will have access to the subsidy.
- **Coaches/Leaders with a Disability** - Any coach who has a registered disability or who can demonstrate working with riders who have a disability.

**What further information do I need to provide if I coach riders from a SIMD 1-4 decile?**

To demonstrate your coaching with riders from SIMD areas, you need to provide details of the programmes and session in your clubs that feature riders from SIMD areas and their postcodes to prove validity.

**Can I apply for more than one category of funding?**

Coaches/leaders can only apply for one category of funding.

**When should I apply for Scottish Cycling subsidy?**

Applications must be completed **prior** to the commencement of your course. Subsidy cannot be guaranteed for applications that are received after the course has commenced. We recommend that coaches/leaders apply for subsidy as soon as possible.

**Am I guaranteed to receive funding?**

Coaches/leaders are not guaranteed to receive for funding. If you are unsuccessful in an application for funding the reasons for this will be communicated to you directly.

Scottish Cycling receives a set amount of subsidy each financial year from **sportscotland**. In the circumstance where demand is greater than the level of subsidy available, Scottish Cycling will aim to make subsidy available, but this cannot be guaranteed.

**If successful, when will I receive funding?**

Scottish Cycling subsidy is processed when a candidate attends the first **in-person** session with their tutor.

**Can I apply for subsidy as a private course organiser?**

This will be done on a case-by-case basis. Please contact the Scottish Cycling team to discuss further.

**Can I apply on behalf of someone else?**

You are only permitted to apply on behalf of someone if you are a representative of a club using a club account for reimbursement, or if you're a parent of a child taking part in a course. Details of both the applicant and the person applying will be captured.
